Annual Report

Here are some highlights/overviews of the programs and projects that were undertaken by KOA Board this year, and giving you a preview of the programs in pipeline for 2024.

•The year 2023 started with "Remembrance of Exodus Day" in January.

February

A Samohic Herath Pooja was conducted this year again on Shivratri by Pandit Pawan Ji from India. As you all know this is the 3rd consecutive year that the Pooja has been held across the USA and Canada with more than 300 families attending and participating virtually every year in the pooja.

March

Distribution of KOA Calendars and Vedic Panchang. This year in addition to the Prem Nath Jotshi's Jantri/calendar, we introduced for the first time the addition of Vedic Panchang prepared specifically for 4 time zones in USA. The alternative to the Jantri which most of us use was made due to an increasing demand by some zones to follow the Vedic Panchang.

April

• KOA sponsored E-Library at Jagati Camp was inaugurated. The library at Jagati is run by Helpline Humanity and Mata Saraswati Pustakalya for many years. This year KOA and Avinash Raina Foundation upgraded the library. The library was digitalized, Computers were added, cubicles created, conductive environment given to students who were also given access to online courses that helped them to excel in their courses.







April

• Youth Trip to Chicago in April. This year our youth had a fantastic weekend trip in Chicago. About 60 young KP Youth attended the 3-day Camp.



July

4th of July -KOA East Coast Camp- A very successful and well attended camp was hosted by Philadelphia this year. Attended by about 350 people, this camp was remarked as one of

the best camps held by KOA.

Among many community activities, the highlights of camp were:

- Inauguration of KOA sponsored book edited by History of Kashmir and its Pandits',
- •Screening of movie- 'Moute Rang' directed by Mr. Ajay Raina.
- •Our sincere thanks to the Camp Team led by Mr. Ishet Dhar and Mr. Rajiv Razdan for delivering fantastic camp.



August

• First time ever- KOA's participation in The India Day Parade in New York.

KOA had the opportunity to show the KP Culture by presenting a KOA FLOAT which showcased our culture and way of life in Kashmir. The central theme revolved around Shaivism, a way of life of a typical KP household and the Kashmiri Music. The float was decorated with marigolds representing the sun with its positive energy.











August

•Meeting with His Holiness Gurudev Sri Sri Ravi Shankar. In August this year a KOA delegation met with his Holiness Sri Sri Ravi Shankar and spent a few hours talking about ways in which our community can benefit from the teachings of Guruji. We also discussed the ways in which our cultural heritage can be preserved particularly Kashmiri Shaivism.




- •September-Labor Day weekend West Coast KOA Camp in Cupertino CA was held. The highlight of the camp was:

 KOA Performance at the World Culture Festival: On Oct 1st 50+ volunteers performed on stage at the National Mall in Washington D.C. It was an awe inspiring, memorable event attended by 1.1 million people and 17,000 performers from 180 countries. KOA was one of the performers. This was a once in a lifetime event where we got the opportunity to perform in front of world dignitaries. We had carefully selected the song we performed to "Paade Kamlan Tal" a popular Kashmiri Bhajan dedicated to Goddess Saraswati.



October – December

In Dec, the President, Dr. Archana Kokroo and youth representative, Ms. Shruti Jalali visited Jammu to meet with our volunteers who help us run KOA Programs and to thank them for their dedicated service to the community. They visited Jagati Migrant Camp, Muthi Migrant Camp, Sharika Foundation and Helpline Humanity Office in Jagati. A report by our Youth Representative, Shruti Jalali, from zone 5 was shared with the membership in December.

During this visit, EAP checks were distributed to the students.





SAC Process


Standardized & Simpler

In 2021 under the leadership of Archana Ji – KOA took up the noble mission of helping our bredrin in distress and suffering from COVID pandemic. The program was approved by the board. The fundraising was done under this program banner and distributed to verified needy bredrin in various parts of India. The program was divided in to two parts:

KOA Family Sustenance Program.

The **program objective** is to serve our community members in critical need for survival and sustenance. Our community members who are very significantly impacted by COVID Pandemic. Lend a helping hand to KP Community in India suffering from COVID related hardships

- The program was advertised by word of mouth and via the coordinators in Jammu
- Received 65+ Applications for support
- As on Date 60+ family's were verified approved and \$65,000 funds were distributed.
- One family recently supported in Valley for hardship due to deaths in the family from shootings

KOA – Kitchen Sustenance Program

The **program objective** is to support the KP families in Kashmir valley and help them make their end meet during the hard times. 44 families in Kashmir valley are suffering from COVID related hardships and have requested assistance of about Rs 2000/- per month per family

- The program was advertised by word of mouth and via the coordinators Valley
- Program is active and supporting 44 family's on monthly basis
- List of 55 families received from our associates in valley
- The support packages were developed with necessary food supplies
- Distribution of the packages done on monthly / bimonthly basis depending on the feasibility and situation on ground.
