

DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

Dear Biradari,

This past year KOA has been a part of some truly Historic events which will be remembered by our volunteers for a long time.

The first ever KOA Float in India Day Parade in NY 2023. Last October we were part of a National India Day Parade in NY. The KOA float in was first of its kind as we presented our religious heritage and our way of life to thousands of people watching the parade in NY. Our participation in the World Culture Festival at the National Mall in Washington DC was attended by millions of people and the world celebrities, dignitaries, and politicians.

This year we continue to promote KOA on the national level.

Invitation to Kalash Poojan for the Consecration of the Ram Temple at Ayodhya by BAPS Robbinsville. A historic moment for Hindu Dharma! Devotees thronged the Temple in NJ to participate in this sacred ceremony on a freezing day! KOA was invited to the Kalash Pooja, along with other major organizations of the area. I had the honor of carrying the Holy Kalash along with other dignitaries participating the Prana Pratishtha Poojan for Lord Rama welcoming him home! It was a powerful moment to participate in an historical event that will define Hindu Dharma for a long time. KOA was also recognized as a premier organization at this event in front of thousands of devotees!

Exodus Day Commemoration and Interview with PadmaShree Mr. K. N Pandita. January 19th, this year remembrance was done in the form of a video message by the KOA Board and KOA youth by sharing our heartfelt message about our Genocide. It has been 34 long years, but the emotions are still fresh and painful! We invited one of our eminent scholars of Kashmir history Padma Shri K.N. Pandita on this commemoration to discuss the 7th Exodus and the effects of generational genocide on our community under the brutal and tyrannical Muslim rule for 700+ years. The Seventh exodus and the Genocide of our community has not yet been recognized by the world. We continue to seek Justice for crimes committed against our community since 1990.

Community Visit To Austin. Earlier this year, I visited Austin, Texas at the invitation of zone 5 Director Mrs. Anjana Kaul. It was wonderful to be among our vibrant Austin community. I thank them for the love and hospitality they showed me during that visit. It was indeed a family get-together with delicious home cooked meal and lots of fun! A range of topics were discussed at this community meeting, including hosting the KOA national camp in Colorado. Seeing the enthusiasm and the passion of the volunteers, it was decided that the KOA Annual camp will be held at Estes Park Colorado this year. We are looking forward to seeing all of you at Estes Park among the beautiful Rocky Mountains.

KOA calendars and Tithi Panchangs. As a tradition this year also, we have shared the KOA calendar with our community irrespective of their membership status. Those who are lifetime members, and some annual members were mailed a printed copy of the same. We also shared this calendar with our community in Canada.

I thank Mrs. Neelam Wali of Boston, who has been compiling and designing these calendars for decades. Her volunteerism and commitment to the community is commendable.

In addition to the traditional calendars, **KOA** also created Four Time Zone Tithi Panchangs, which are specific to EST, CST, MST AND PST time zones. These Panchangs were compiled by Jyotshi Puneet ji from Jammu. This is an additional religious resource specifically created by KOA for those community members who follow the time zone Tithi Calendar in USA.

Hindu Educational Society of Kashmir-KOA Scholarship Program

Keeping up with the our mission and commitment to those Education Institutes that are contributing towards enhancing our culture, spirituality, and philosophy, this year KOA has started a scholarship program with the Hindu Education Society of Kashmir. This college is based in Jammu and is an extension of the well-known and recognized Gandhi College of Srinagar. The scholarship program was created in lieu of donations made by Dr. Ashoke Raina of Maryland to the college. This scholarship will be provided to 4 college going students in Jammu coming from under privileged families who are seeking courses at the HESK college. This is a 4-year scholarship program. The selection of the scholarship recipients will be done collaboratively by the KOA and HESK committee. This program will provide scholarships in addition to the existing KOA's EAP program for college bound students.

Revival of the Heritage Committee- The KOA Board this January voted to Revive the Heritage Committee, which had been discontinued years back. The objective of this committee is to work on specific projects and programs in concordance with KOA Board on area of Language, Religious philosophy, Kashmiri Pandit art and literature, help in raising funds to preserve religious places and shrines in J&K. In 2023, KOA raised funds to renovate a section of ShivalunTemple in Srinagar. In January this year we collaborated with Aalath.com run by Mr. Vishal Kachroo to bring Kashmiri language classes to our community here in USA. The classes are ongoing and many young adults and children are taking advantage of it. Currently the Heritage committee is presenting workshops on Kashmiri Shaivism that will run through June 2024.

Reviving the Folklores of Kashmir. We are currently working on our next project to preserve our language, art and folklores. We have collaborated with esteemed and respected literary figures in Jammu to create audio books on our folklores. For the pilot project 2 well known Folk tales were chosen Hemal Naigray and Akanandun. Work is being done in Jammu.

The SAC and EAP educational programs for year 2023 were closed and both surpassed the number of scholarships given out for the previous year.

Under SAC KOA granted 461 scholarships to School going children and under EAP we gave out scholarship to 240 College going students coming from poor families. The SAC program for 2024 is open for donations. I request an appeal to you all to donate to this program so that we can help educate more students this year.

Since this is an issue very close to our hearts, the ZoomDub team interviewed the team of 'Article 370'.

As it has become a tradition, this year again KOA celebrated Shivratri as a community partaking in the Samohik Puja. The priest, Pawan ji led the puja. It has given many families an opportunity to participate in a guided Herath pooja.

Our annual camps are at the core of KOA's activities. Apart from the National Camp and the West Coast camp, the Youth Trips have been a hit with our youngsters. This is the third year with a record 60 youth attending this trip in Washington DC and many could not be accommodated due to logistic reasons.

The National Camp is being held in Estes Park, Colorado. It is being organized in Zone 5 with Mrs. Anita Kaul as the Camp Commander and the Zone 5 director Mrs. Anjana Kaul and the team providing the support. We look forward to seeing you all there. The West Coast Camp will be held in the Greater Seattle Area. The details are being worked out.

As part of the KOA's mission of helping the Kashmiri brethren in Jammu Camps, we donated a mortuary van to the Jagati Camp earlier this year. When Archana Ji was visiting the camps in November 2023, the residents had requested her for it.

We hope to see you all at the camp.


KOA Youth Trip 2024 - Washington D.C.





Revival of KOA Heritage Committee

The Kashmiri Overseas Association (KOA) has revived the Heritage Preservation Committee. The Committee's mission is to globally preserve and promote Kashmiri Pandit heritage. This includes safeguarding literature, fostering art and science, documenting history, and promoting cultural and spiritual heritage.



Key Initiatives:

- Kashmiri Shaivism Workshops: Introductory workshops led by Vijay Dhar with over 70 participants were started. Plans for advanced workshops with renowned experts are underway.
- **Kashmir Heritage display:** Partnered with Avanti Foundation and KHF to set up a Kashmir Heritage display in Fremont, CA library for the month of April.

KOA in collaboration with <u>aalath.com</u> started online Kashmiri Classes. This is our continued effort to preserve our culture of which language is the cornerstone.

We request the community to proactively partner with us so that our youngsters learn to speak the language by having them join the classes. If you have any questions, please reach out to us.



In April, we started the membeship drive month and as a 'Thank you' gesture and letting you know that we appreciate your membership, we are offering choice of a gift.




